SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST—2020-2021

NOTE: the pictures on all items should be acceptable to the Lord

Each student needs to bring all of the following items except noted by age.

Please note: Returning students may reuse pencil pouches and scissors from last year if they are in good condition.

- Four LARGE BOXES OF TISSUES we never have enough of these! (Nicer quality makes for less sore noses for frequent users.) If you know your child suffers from allergies PLEASE provide extra tissues. We can go through a box of tissues every couple of days during certain seasons.
- One LARGE-Family Size package of table napkins per student (Each student MUST use two at every lunch.)
- A backpack of sorts DAILY REQUIREMENT (Because of Covid-19 backpacks will not be used this year.)
- Two water bottles (leak-proof lid-no straws) Please put your child's name on both. One will be stored at school as a backup. Because of the disruption recyclable water bottles cause when your children flip, crunch, and twist them, please refrain from sending them.
- Two sturdy cloth pencil pouches
- Two sturdy coated folders: with two bottom pockets (No side pocket folders)
- One VINYL/PLASTIC sturdy two-bottom-pocket folder for traveling to and from school
- Six red pencils six glue sticks that work (cheap ones are not a good buy)
- One pack of copy paper <u>PER STUDENT</u> 500 sheets (we can always use extra!)
- One pack of color pencils basic colors without erasers
- One box of crayons (all students for art)
- Two single subject spiral notebooks (College Ruled not recycled paper) AGES 7 AND UP

• PENCILS:

AGE 5-6: will be provided
AGE 7 and up: 24 - #2 lead pencils
(name brand that will sharpen
easily) - NO MECHANICAL PENCIL

• <u>ERASERS:</u> several large, soft, erasers (appropriate especially for art)

SCISSORS:

AGE 5-9: age appropriate that cut nicely
AGE 10 and up: good pair of adult-size that cut nicely

MARKERS:

All students: One box of 8 count broad-tipped CRAYOLA CLASSIC MARKERS - PLEASE, and one pack fined-tipped markers (non-permanent) For art

• <u>ONE – 2 INCH THREE</u> RING BINDER (for Acellus)

Age 7 and up: with bottom inside pockets. Sturdy, non-flexible sides

- <u>AGE 10 and up:</u> stick or roll-on deodorant (no aerosols) DAILY REQUIREMENT. Please instruct your child how to properly use the stick deodorant to prevent it breaking off and littering the carpet. Some students tend to leave a trail. A mild-body cologne is also permissible and nice but not in aerosol form.
- <u>KINDERGARTEN ONLY:</u> one extra outfit to be kept at school in case of accidents or spills. (Pants, shirt, underwear, socks. Keep in mind they may need these in the colder months, so make them "all season" clothing. Please bring the clothes in a Ziploc bag labeled with your child's name.)
- One pair of inexpensive sneakers that will be kept at school as inside shoes. (Velcro is great for the younger students. These must NOT be slippers and they must also be supportive enough to stay on your child's feet. NO GLITTER PLEASE!)

NOTE: PLEASE SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL IN SHOES THAT WILL BE APPROPRIATE FOR OUTSIDE USE ON THE EQUIPMENT AND RUNNING AROUND IN THE GRASS WHICH IS SOMETIMES DAMP AND SLIPPERY.

(GOOD GRIPPING SOLE FOR RUNNING, WELL FITTING, ETC. BUT ARE ALSO EASY FOR THE CHILD TO PUT ON WITHOUT ASSISTANCE.) Please keep in mind our dress code (no sandals, clogs, or cowboy boots and socks must be worn at all times) Velco/zippers style is a good choice to prevent tripping on those untied shoelaces. There are so many no-tie options available now. I know students need to know how to tie, but here at school so much time is wasted on telling them to tie their shoes. It seems as if some shoelaces these days just refuse to stay tied no matter who ties them! Untied shoelaces dragging on the floor become a real safety issue for your child and others.

A number of students have been wearing inappropriate shoes for recess. Boots of any type should not be worn except in snowy weather. They are not appropriate for playing outside. The students cannot not run freely iand safely n them. Please make sure your child understands this important safety rule.

Also, please make sure your child can easily and independently change into their outside or inside shoes. Some students miss several minutes of their recess time just trying to change shoes.

No electronic devices, gum or candy are allowed on the student.
